Master of Science in Construction Project Management (2019-20)

1. Applications are invited for admission in September 2019 to the Master of Science in Construction Project Management programme (with/without a major option) (one year full-time and two year part-time modes). Details of the programme can be found at <https://www.arch.hku.hk/programmes/rec/master-of-science-in-construction-project-management/>.
2. To be eligible for admission to the programmes, applicants shall satisfy both the University Entrance Requirements and the Programme Specific Requirements. They shall:
 - (a) comply with the General Regulations and the Regulations for Taught Postgraduate Curricula;
 - (b) hold a Bachelor's degree of this University or a qualification of equivalent standard from this University or another comparable institution accepted for this purpose;
 - (c) shall satisfy the University English language requirement applicable to higher degrees as prescribed under General Regulation G2(b); and
 - (d) satisfy the examiners in a qualifying examination if required.
3. Filing an application is a two-step process. First, applicants have to submit their applications via the taught postgraduate online application system at <https://hku.hk/tpg>. Second, after the online application is submitted, applicants will receive instructions, via email, to upload the following supporting documents to the Faculty's "Document Submission System":
 - Curriculum vitae (CV)
 - Latest official academic transcript of undergraduate (and postgraduate) studies
 - Graduation certificate of undergraduate (and postgraduate) studies
 - TOEFL/IELTS official score report*
 - School attendance certificate^

**a must for applicants from degree programmes not taught in English*
**highly recommended for all other applicants*

4. In addition, applicants are required to invite two referees to evaluate their abilities to pursue a postgraduate study. After the online application is submitted, the referees will receive an invitation email to complete an online form and upload a signed reference letter to the Faculty's "Referee Report System".
5. An application fee of HK\$300, which must be paid by credit card online, is non-refundable and non-transferrable. Once the application is submitted, information in the application cannot be changed.
6. The closing date for application (all steps above) is **12:00 noon, 31 January 2019 (Thursday) (HKT).**
Late application is normally not considered.
7. Applicants may be invited to attend an admission interview within 3 months after the application deadline.
8. Applicants are **NOT** required to post any physical supporting documents to the Faculty office at the application stage. If an applicant is given an admission offer, he/she will be notified to submit the originals or the certified true copies of all supporting documents for offer acceptance.
9. Composition fee for the MSc(CPM) programme in the academic year 2019-20:


